## RESOLUTION IN RECOGNITION OF NCJFCJ'S 80<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

**WHEREAS**, on May 22, 1937, the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges (NCJFCJ) was established by judges who came together with a vision of strengthening the juvenile court system, and to provide support, share knowledge, and facilitate an exchange of ideas with their colleagues across the nation; and

**WHEREAS**, the NCJFCJ is the oldest judicial membership organization in the country and the leading provider of judicial education; and

**WHEREAS**, the NCJFCJ believes judges are the leaders of the juvenile and family court system, and by engaging all stakeholders in the system better decisions are made with improved outcomes for children, families, and victims of domestic violence; and

**WHEREAS**, for eight decades the NCJFCJ has been known for the exemplary quality of its services, including advanced education, training, publications, technical assistance, research, data and statistics, and policy development to promote justice for children and families; and

**WHEREAS**, inspired by the leadership, experience, expertise, dedication and passion of its members, the NCJFCJ is committed to another 80 years of efforts to meet the ever-evolving needs of our most vulnerable population – the children and families who seek justice;
